TO : All District Commissioners, Deputy District Commissioners, Heads of Institutions, District Field Commissioners (DFCs), Unit Leaders, PTA Officials/Members, SK Chairmen and All Boy & Senior Scouts.

SUBJECT : 2016 PATROL/CREW LEADERS TRAINING COURSES SCHEDULES


1. In line with the K to 12 Program of the Department of Education to develop our students holistically, we are announcing the schedules of the Patrol/Crew Leaders Training Courses for 2016, to wit;
 - August 5-7, 2016 - Baclayon National High School, Baclayon, Bohol for CD I
 - Freedom Park, Poblacion, Pilar, Bohol for Pilar District
 - August 12-14, 2016 - Duero Central Elementary School, Duero, Bohol for CD III
 - August 26-28, 2016 - Sagbayan Central Elem. School, Sagbayan, Bohol for CD II
2. This is conducted with the aim of contributing to the holistic development of our boys through scouting and to the formation and producing self-less, dependable and most of all, God-fearing Leaders and Citizens of our society in the years to come. This is also in preparation for the coming scouting activities for the Manuel L. Quezon Memorial Camp in August and the Scouting Month in October.
3. A training fee of Two Hundred Fifty (250.00) Pesos will be charged to each participant to defray the expenses for manuals, certificates and training materials chargeable to the MOOE or to any available local school funds.
4. Transportation to and from the venue and food provision throughout the duration of the training will be the responsibility of the participants. They will be cooking for their own meal as part of the training which will be monitored and supervised by the training staff. Scouts should be the ones cooking for their meal not the accompanying adults.
5. All districts/secondary schools are encouraged to send their potential boy leaders to the venue and schedule where they belong or in which they are most comfortable. To maintain discipline in the camp, only maximum of 8 scouts (composed of 4 boys and 4 seniors) from each municipality is encouraged with adult leadership. Service credits will be granted to teachers who will serve as training staff and chaperons provided they are also registered in the camp along with their scouts and shall follow the standard of 1 adult in every 4 scouts. It is encouraged that accompanying adults are graduates of the Advanced training Course of their section or at least of the Basic training Course and will be utilized as support staff during the training for them to be familiar with the skills and activities in scouting and also maintain the security of the scouts on the duration of the training.


6. All delegates must assemble at the respective venue at 8:00 o'clock in the morning of the first day in Type A Uniform or at least with a scout neckerchief for registration, organization, camp set up and opening program and must bring the following since this will be a training-in-camp:


- Type A & B uniforms
- tent and sleeping gears
- mess kit and toiletries
- ropes for knot tying
- first aid kit
- Raincoat
- compass
- rubber shoes and slippers
- Notebook and ball pen
- extra shirts and underwear
- scout knife and flashlights (optional)
- cooking and kitchen utensils
