The 41st GSP National Camp to be hosted by the Northern Luzon Region and co-hosted by Ilocos Sur Girl Scout Council with the theme "BE PREPARED: Girl Scouts in Action" will be held on December 1-6, 2018 at Gabriela Silang Girl Scout Camp in Banaoang, Bantay, Ilocos Sur.

As per policy, a Council is allotted to send 1 Patrol (8 Girls) of Senior or Cadet Girl Scouts to the National Camp with 1 official Troop Leader chaperone who will attend the National Troop Leaders Forum on December 2-5.

Council Subsidized Camp Fee

The subsidized camp fee is Fifteen Thousand Pesos (P15,000.00) per camper inclusive of expenses on transportation (airfare, bus/van fare), food, accommodation, program materials, camp souvenirs, and group insurance.

The camp/registration fee of the participants may be charged against Division/School Maintenance and Other Operating Expenses (MOOE), District share of SMFC tickets, local and other sources of funds subject to its availability, and the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

Pre-Campference and Departure for Manila

The campers shall have the pre-campference on November 29, Thursday (8:00 A.M.) at the Council Program and Training Center in Tamblot Street, Tagbilaran City; and will depart for Manila in the afternoon of the same day.

Camping Activities

The campers will experience the following exciting and adventure-filled activities:

Wide Games Colors, Eco-Cultural Adventure (8 Point Challenge), Disaster Preparedness, Orienteering, Amazing Taekwondo, Zip lining, Wall Climbing, Rappelling, Free Being Me (Action on Body Confidence Phase 3), Colors, Scout's Own, Thanksgiving Mass/Religious Service, Campfire, Artsy Me, Inter-Tent Visit, Songs, and Dances.

Qualifications of Campers

- 1. Must be a registered Senior/Cadet Girl Scout as of December 2018.
- 2. Must be physically fit and alert.
- 3. Must have earned at least one badge each under the 8-Point Challenge.
- 4. Must have attended a troop/patrol/council/regional camp prior to this camp.
- 5. Must be a Patrol Leader's Camp Permit Course Certificate Holder or has attended the Patrol Leader's Camp Permit Course.

Things to Bring

These should be brought by the individual camper and packed in a duffle bag and a backpack/knapsack provided with luggage tags. Travel Luggage and/or Trolley Bags (Maleta) will not be allowed inside the camp. Campers are encouraged to travel light, and bring only what is needed.
