SUBJECT : 42nd NATIONAL CAMP, AND NATIONAL TROOP LEADERS FORUM 2019

DATE : NOVEMBER 21, 2019

The **42nd GSP National Camp** with the theme **“Girl Scouts: Resilient, Accountable, and Productive”** to be hosted by the Western Mindanao Region and Zamboanga Del Norte Girl Scout Council will be held on **December 1-6, 2019** at **Cogon Eco-Tourism Park in Dipolog City, Zamboanga Del Norte.**

Simultaneous with the National Camp will be the **National Troop Leaders Forum 2019** with the theme **“Basic and Beyond”** to be held on **December 3-5, 2019** at **Manuel Resort in Poblacion North Piñan, Zamboanga del Norte.**

As per policy, of the Girl Scouts of the Philippines National Headquarters, each Council is allotted to send 1 Patrol (8 Girls) of Senior or Cadet Girl Scouts to the National Camp; and One (1) official Troop Leader chaperone who will attend the National Troop Leaders Forum.

Qualifications of Campers

1. Must be a registered Senior/Cadet Girl Scout as of December 2019.
2. Must be physically fit and alert..
3. Must have earned at least one badge each under the 8-Point Challenge.
4. Must have attended a troop/patrol/council/regional camp prior to this camp.
5. Must be a Patrol Leader's Camp Permit Course Certificate Holder or has attended the Patrol Leader's Camp Permit Course.

Council Subsidized Camp Fee

The subsidized camp fee is Eleven Thousand Two Hundred Pesos (P11,200.00) per camper inclusive of expenses on transportation (boat, bus/van fare), food, accommodation, program materials, camp souvenirs, and group insurance.

The camp/registration fee of the participants may be charged against Division/School Maintenance and Other Operating Expenses (MOOE), District share of SMFC tickets, local and other sources of funds subject to its availability, and the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.


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
