Action Against Hunger is grateful for the ongoing partnership with the DepEd's Schools Division of Bohol. Coordination and preliminary discussions have been done, especially through the office of the Schools Governance and Operations Department in the Division of Bohol.

As mentioned with the previous letter, Action Against Hunger is currently implementing the project, "Immediate and Comprehensive Response for Communities Affected by Typhoon Rai in the Philippines" to the 12 municipalities in Bohol (list attached). This is an ECHO funded project that aimed to meet the urgent multi-sectoral humanitarian needs of the most vulnerable population living in disadvantaged and remote areas, and this includes Education in Emergencies. Below are some of the activities to be conducted:

- Capacity Development on distance learning and drop-out reduction program
- Provision of schools with equipment and education materials to support distance learning and drop-out reduction
- Provide grade-appropriate learning materials to some selected pupils/students
- Setting-up of community-based learning kiosk
- Training of community volunteers, teachers, and youth council leaders (on protection and safeguarding, risk communication and disease prevention.

In the abovementioned regard, we would like to call for a meeting with the Public School District Supervisors (PSDS) of the target municipalities, together with the office of the SGOD. Please see attachment for the list. This meeting is proposed to be conducted on Thursday, June 16, 2022 at 10 AM to 2 PM in Soledad Suites lobby, A Borja Street, Tagbilaran, Bohol.

We also appreciate if the PSDS could bring data on the result of the Rapid Damage and Needs Assessment (RDANA) of schools on Typhoon Odette.

Immediate and Comprehensive Response for Communities Affected by Typhoon Rai in the Philippines

Funded by European Union **Humanitarian Aid**









Typhoon Rai (local name Odette) made its landfall in the Philippines last December 16, 2021. It affected more than 12 million individuals when it ravaged 11 regions across the Philippines (OCHA). The typhoon caused extensive damage to houses and infrastructure, agriculture, livelihoods, and the ecosystems that protect and nourish them. As of April 27, 2022, more than 12,000 households remain displaced across areas.

Typhoon Rai had its greatest impact on at-risk communities in both urban and rural areas in the country. Pre-existing vulnerabilities such as high poverty rates, low sanitation and hygiene standards, and limited livelihood opportunities compounded the impact of the typhoon to affected families.

The disaster has magnified inequalities and has resulted in the deprivation of women and the most marginalized sectors of their basic and fundamental rights - including food, water, shelter, and protection, among others.

In response to the looming humanitarian crises on top of the COVID-19 pandemic, the European Civil Protection and Humanitarian Aid Operations has provided funding to local and international actors working to deliver life-saving assistance to Typhoon Rai-affected communities.



About the Action

The Action "Immediate and Comprehensive Response for Communities Affected by Typhoon Rai in the Philippines" will serve at least 300,000 individuals across the provinces of Bohol, Cebu, Dinagat Islands, Southern Levte, Negros Occidental, and Palawan.

The Action will ensure access to safe, dignified. inclusive, and immediate assistance to the most at-risk families and individuals in poor, remote, and difficult to reach areas who have received little to no support due to several humanitarian barriers.

This Action is supported by the European Civil Protection and Humanitarian Aid Operations and is implemented by CARE, ACCORD, Inc., National Rural Women's Coalition, Plan International, and Action Against Hunger.

Food assistance and livelihood recovery and protection activities



Provision of hygiene items, hygiene promotion activities, and repair of communal WASH facilities



Provision for shelter repair kits and community-based technical assistance for safer and stronger shelters



Support the delivery of primary health services



Provision for learning and teaching materials and organizing safe learning spaces



Access to protection services, referral pathways, and feedback mechanisms
