

The ICC Coordinator will then provide you a specific area of assignment. Attached is the list of ICC Coordinators with their respective contact numbers for your reference. You may encourage the volunteers to bring empty sacks, brooms, tongs and utility gloves in picking-up the wastes.

For record purposes, we are providing you ICC Data Trash Form per institution. You are further requested to submit immediately after the clean-up your duly accomplished/filled-out ICC Data Trash Form to your Coordinator in your respective areas of assignment. The coordinator shall submit these consolidated forms with photo documentation on or before **September 26, 2022** to the **Bohol Provincial Environment Management Office (BPEDO)** with email address at bpemophil@gmail.com.
