H. INTRODUCTION AND OVERVIEW

The Philippine Red Cross is an organization dedicated to providing humanitarian aid while alleviating human suffering. In order to give effective service and provide the necessary assistance, the Philippine Red Cross is composed of six major services focusing on different aspects of help. One of those major services is the Red Cross Youth whose mission is to educate the youth to speak out, act and be heard by providing opportunities to empower them in the Spirit of Volunteerism through various training and effective leadership thereby directing their energy, creativity, and innovation into worthwhile humanitarian activities.

This year, Red Cross Youth - Bohol Chapter is here for a myriad of factors, notably a more visible youth volunteer representation, a more closely knit volunteer-driven community, and a humanized leadership approach for the youth and to the youth. One of the many activities hosted by the Red Cross Youth is the RCY Bohol Assembly Camp. It is an annual, 5-day camping activity of the organization open to all youth (13-25) to further improve unity and camaraderie through outdoor survival activities and youth-centered sessions in partnership with the 2 services of PRC, DMS/IHL and Safety Service.

Three years have passed since the COVID-19 pandemic forced us into a drastic paradigm shift – challenging our volunteerism and ideals for creating a thriving Red Cross Youth community. In spite of this, together with the lessons learned and the difficulties conquered, we take these experiences in stride as our north star to transition into the new normal. Thus, this year's camp with the theme: **“MARVEL: Sisarsi, Sisrate”**, focuses on the safety and resilience of the youth amidst all the challenges. *Marvel* entails astonishment and the Sanskrit word *Sisarsi, Sisrate* means *to flow, run, and hurry* which depicts the aim of the present time after the start of the pandemic crisis. It is time to be filled with wonder and make the current flow running and be steadfast in our mission to empower the Spirit of Volunteerism of the youth as they embark on a 5-day camp where they will be directly involved in learning first aid and safety instructions and disaster risk management, as well as testing their survival abilities.

RCY Bohol Assembly Camp 2022 will also hold the Chapter Youth Assembly which aims to assemble more practical and holistic youth volunteers as they address the current social issues by engaging with fellow youth from different parts of the province, empowering them to be youth advocates, and take limitless actions as agents of change.

I. GENERAL OBJECTIVES

The RCY Bohol Assembly Camp 2022 takes up the challenge to respond to the signs of times in the new world; let our spirit of volunteerism be here and now. This aims to link youth's involvement in safety and disaster risk management. Furthermore, it aims

to teach first aid and safety modalities among its campers as they enhance their leadership and survival abilities.

J. METHODOLOGY

The RCY Bohol Assembly Camp 2022 is inspired by the Marvel Cinematic Universe (MCU), specifically The Avengers. The camp will be having outdoor sessions and survival activities with speaker-facilitators of S.H.I.E.L.D. as the campers immerse themselves in the different aspects of youth enhancement in line with safety and resilience. They will integrate various approaches of learning to the campers to inspire them to commit their responsibility and voluntary service to humanity. The campers will be divided into 11 groups. The groups' name is inspired by The Avengers namely:

- (1) Iron Man
- (2) Captain America
- (3) Thor
- (4) Black Widow
- (5) Hulk
- (6) Spider-Man
- (7) Vision
- (8) Doctor Strange
- (9) Black Panther
- (10) Ant-Man

The extermination of half of all life in the universe because of the Blip is deemed similar to the COVID-19 pandemic. Now, the S.H.I.E.L.D. are hiring new agents as part of the Avengers and are given the mission to retrieve the 6 Infinity Stones. The campers will be challenged by the kick-off survival mission upon arrival at the campsite. The mission is simply the training ground before the campers shall partake in the Time Heist. This will then jumpstart the beginning of the camp.

The sessions will be named according to the 6 Infinity Stones in the Infinity Gauntlet like: **(1) "Soul Stone: First Aid and Safety"**, which trains the campers about first aid and emergency response to sudden injuries linked to the Soul Stone that represents the soul and allows for life after death; **(2) "Time Stone: Disaster Risk Reduction and Management"**, teaches the participants about disaster preparedness and readiness linked to the Time Stone that represents manipulation of time, as shown by Doctor Strange who was able to turn time backwards and forwards to restore reality far from destruction; **(3) "Power Stone: Swimming and Water Rescue"**, which trains the campers on water safety, rescue and survival techniques linked to the Power Stone that allows the wielder to manipulate all forms of energy and enhance their physical and psychological strengths; **(4) "Reality Stone: HIV/AIDS & Substance Abuse Prevention"**, which aims to raise awareness towards prevention of using harmful substances as well as clarifying the misconceptions of HIV linked to the Reality Stone that can alter reality and change/re-shape anything through the wielder's imagination; **(5) Mind Stone Survival Mission** which officially test the learnings of the campers linked to the Mind Stone that allows the user to enhance their mind, awaken or

heighten psionic abilities; and (6) **“Space Stone: Search and Rescue”**, which take up the campers on a challenging mission to rescue casualties in a catastrophe linked to the Space Stone that wield the power to teleport anywhere and open doorway in the multiverse.

In order to assess their learning, attitude, and other necessary skills, the campers will be having outdoor activities and survival games throughout the duration of the event, and a Mind Stone Survival Mission, a written test will be conducted, considered as a session. One of the camp’s highlights is the annual Solferino Race dubbed as “Avengers: Infinity War”, a Red Cross Youth-way teambuilding activity, in which the participants will face various challenges that will test their trust, unity and cooperation with one another.

K. EXPECTED PARTICIPANTS

There will be 200 expected youth participants with an age range of 13-25 years old
