# Social Benefits



#### i. Disability and Dismemberment Benefit

- up to a maximum of Php 100,000.00 for accident-related injuries

#### Requirements

- 1. Foreign medical certificate
- Medical certificate issued by the local attending physician with medical examination procedure (e.g X-ray, MRI, CT Scan)
- 3. Accident Report/Master's Report for sea-based OFW

#### ii. Death and Burial Benefits

- Php 100,000.00 for natural cause
- Php 200,000.00 for accidental cause
- On top of death benefit, a rider of Php 20,000.00 will be received by the beneficiaries for the funeral expenses.

#### ✓ Requirements

- Original Death Certificate issued by the local civil registrar or authenticated by the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA)
- Foreign Death Certificate for OFWs who died abroad including Airway Bill and Consular Mortuary Certificate or No Objection Certificate
- 3. Accident Report for death due to accident
- 4. Burial permit
- 5. Official receipt of funeral expenses
- 6. 2 valid IDs and 1 pc. ID picture of claimant
- 7. Certificate of no marriage (CENOMAR) of OFW from PSA
- 8. Any of the applicable documents certified by local civil registrar (LCR) or PS
  - o Marriage certificate if claimant is the spouse
  - o Birth certificate of OFW if claimant is father or mother
  - Birth certificate of child and death certificate of deceased spouse if claimant is the child

# Social Benefits

#### iii. Supplemental Medical Assistance for OFWs (MEDplus)

- Supplemental medical relief for active OWWA and PhilHealth member-OFWs who are afflicted with dreaded diseases and were hospitalized, either at the jobsites or while in the Philippines. It is a financial assistance that is equivalent to the PhilHealth benefits under its case rate system, but not to exceed **PhP 50,000.00** per member.

#### ◆Requirements

- Duly accomplished MEDplus application form;
- 2. Copy of PhilHealth Benefit Payment Notice (BPN);
- 3. One (1) copy of passport-size picture;
- Proof of OWWA membership contribution (OWWA O.R., OFW membership record);
- Duly notarized Special Power of Attorney executed by the OFW, if the OFW is abroad and the filer-claimant is the next-of-kin (NOK)
- PSA-authenticated death certificate of deceased OFW and marriage contract or birth certificate of NOK-claimant, if the OFW is deceased.
- Benefit Payment Notice (BPN) is a report of actual payments made by Phili-lealth relative to one's confinement/availment.

iv. Welfare Assistance Program (WAP) - is extended to active or non-active OWWA members or their families not eligible under any of the existing OWWA Social Benefit Programs and Services.

#### **COVERAGE:**

- Calamity Assistance for OWWA members and their families affected by natural or human induced calamities/disasters
- Bereavement Assistance for families of deceased OWWA members.
- Medical Assistance for OWWA members who have illnesses that are not covered under MEDplus and for members who sustained injuries due to accidents/crimes.
- Relief Assistance for OWWA members who were displaced/ laid-off en masse due to economic/political/health situations.

## Education and Training Assistance



#### i. Pre-Departure Education Program

#### a. Country Specific Pre-Departure Orientation Seminar (PDOS)

-A one-day compulsory orientation to OFWs consisting of modules on employment contract, country of destination, stages of the OFWs' life abroad, health and safety, financial literacy, travel tips and airport procedures, and government programs and services.

#### b. Comprehensive Pre-Departure Education Program (CPDEP)

- A two to six-day orientation seminar attended by Domestic Workers (DWs) consisting of language training, culture familiarization, and stress management.
- ii. Training Programs For Filipino Seafarers
- Seafarer's Upgrading Program (SUP) Job related training assistance for upgrading courses of up to Php 7,500.00 per course.
- \*Succeeding availments every after three (3) recorded membership contributions.

#### ✓ Requirements

- 1. Proof of OWWA membership
- 2. Accomplished Application Form
- Seafarer's Identification & Record Book and/or Passport (valid original copy)
- 4. 2"x2" Photo (2 copies)

#### b. Mariners' Dugtong Aral (Bridging) Program

A scholarship grant for prospective seafarers who are graduates of BS Mechanical Engineering (BSME) and to Pursue BSMarine Engineering (BSMarE) course, in the following order of priority:

- OFW-seafarers who are active members of OWWA;
- Immediate dependents/beneficiaries of OFWs, both land-based and sea-based, who are active or former members of OWWA; and
- Next-of-kin of OFWs up to the first degree of consanguinity.

#### Requirements:

- · Birth Certificate/ Proof of Relation to the OFW
- · Transcript of Records
- Declaration of no current and pending application for scholarship with OWWA and other NGAs/NGOs

#### iii. Scholarships For Dependents

#### a. Education for Development Scholarship Program (EDSP)

- Scholarship grant offered to qualified dependents of active OWWA members who intend to pursue a 4-5 year baccalaureate course in any preferred college or university
- Financial assistance of Php 60,000.00 per school year

#### Qualifications for incoming freshmen

- The member-OFW must have an active membership with OWWA at the time of application.
- The dependent-applicant must be single and not be more than 21 years old.
- Must have an average grade of at least 80% and belongs to the upper 20% of the graduating class.
- Must pass the qualifying examination conducted by DOST and belongs to the top 400 examination passer.

# Qualifications for those who are already enrolled in 2nd to 5th year college

- 1. Single
- 2. Not more than 30 years old
- With a GWA not lower than B letter grade or 85% equivalent in all academic and non-academic subjects during the last school year attended in full load

#### Requirements

- 1. Accomplished EDSP Application Form (2 copies)
- 2. 2x2 ID Photos (2 copies)
- 3. Birth Certificate authenticated by PSA
- 4. Certificate of good moral character
- 5. Form 137 for incoming first year college or Transcript of Records or Certificate of Grades for those already enrolled in college
- 6. Certification from the principal that the applicant obtained a general weighted average (GWA) of 80% and that he/she belongs to the top 20% of the graduating class
- b. OFW Dependent Scholarship Program (ODSP) Educational assistance of Php 20,000.00 per school year to qualified dependent of an active OWWA member-OFW whose salary is not more than US\$ 600.00.

### **✓** Qualifications

- Child of an active OWWA member or sibling of an unmarried OWWA member, who is single and not more than 21 years old for incoming freshmen, and not more than 30 years old for those who are already enrolled or have been enrolled in college
- Must pass the entrance examination conducted by state college/university where he/she intends to enroll
- 3. Must not be a recipient of any other scholarship grants

### c. Educational and Livelihood Assistance Program (ELAP)

- Education and livelihood assistance for dependents of deceased member-OFW, including convicted OFWs facing death penalty in host country.
- Educational assistance to qualified dependent per school year:
  - · Php 5,000.00 allowance for elementary
  - · Php 8,000.00 allowance for high school
  - Php 10,000.00 allowance for college or vocational technical course
- Livelihood assistance
  - the surviving heir shall receive Php 15,000.00 worth of livelihood package.

#### **Economic Component Requirements:**

- Accomplished Application Form
- 2. 2 pcs. Passport size pictures
- Proof of relationship to OWWA Member (e.g PSA or Local Civil Registry (LCR)-authenticated birth certificate)
- 4. Proof of OWWA membership of the OFW-member
- 5. Certificate of receipt of the livelihood package
- Consent from intended beneficiary (spouse or parent) that he/she is not interested in the project and is delegating the authority to his/her designated beneficiary who is willing to assume the responsibility for the family

Additional Requirements for Dependents of Convicted OFWs:

- 1. Member-OFW's name in the official list from the Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA) of OFWs who are incarcerated/convicted and meted out of the death penalty in foreign countries.
- 2. For OWWA members who are not included in the list, a certification from DFA shall be required.

iv. Short-Term Training Programs for OFWs and Dependents

a. Skills-for-Employment Scholarship Program (SESP) - Provides technical-vocational training assistance up to a maximum of Php 14,500.00 per course to active member-OFWs and their dependents at any TESDA-accredited training centers.

✓ Requirements

- 1. Proof of OWWA membership for member, and proof of relationship to OFW-member, if dependent/beneficiary
- 2. One (1) OWWA Membership contribution is applicable to one (1) SESP benefit; succeeding availments need three (3) additional membership contributions
- b. Information Technology (IT) Training Program Basic computer literacy program to upgrade the IT skills of OFWs and their families.

i. Repatriation Assistance Program - Bringing back of distressed OFWs and human remains. Emergency repatriation is carried out in th event of any political unrest or natural calamities. Workers are accorde with airport assistance, temporary shelter at the OWWA Halfway Home psycho-social counseling, stress debriefing, and transport services or fares for their onward travel to their respective provinces.

ii. Reintegration Program -

Reintegration is a way of mainstreaming returning OFWs into Philippine society.

- · Value formation training
- · Financial literacy
- Entrepreneurial Development Training
- Techno-skills and capacity building

b. Reintegration (in-country)

- Job referrals
- · Business counseling
- · Community organizing
- · Financial literacy seminar

Balik Pinas! Balik Hanapbuhay! Program - A package of livelihood support/assistance intended to provide immediate relief to returning member-OFWs (distressed/displaced) amounting to a maximum of Php 20,000.00 as start up or additional capital for the livelihood project.

## Requirements

- 1. Application Form (with affidavit of Undertaking that the cash assistance will be used solely for self-employment or for starting or expansion of livelihood project or business)
- 2. Certificate of Entrepreneurial Development Training
- 3. Business Plan/Proposal approved by RWO Director indicating sustainability/feasibility of the chosen livelihood undertaking
- 4. Proof of repatriation or return to the Philippines (passport or travel documents, airline ticket)
- Overseas Filipino Workers Enterprise Development and Loan Program (OFW-EDLP) - Formerly known as OFW Reintegration Program (ORP), this is an enterprise development intervention and loan facility of OWWA, in partnership with Land Bank of the Philippines (LBP) and the Development Bank of the Philippines (DBP), intended to support enterprise development among OFWs and their families.

# Social Services and Family Welfare Services



- Interest Rate 7.5% per annum for the entire duration of the loan
- Loan Purpose Working Capital and Fixed Asset Acquisition
- Project Cost-Sharing Borrower's Equity minimum of 20% of the Total Project Cost (TPC)
- Loan Amount: The loan amount shall depend on project needs and amount of equity participation of the borrower
  - ➤ For Individual Loan Borrowers (single proprietorship)
    - a. Minimum Php100,000.00
    - b. Maximum Php2,000,000.00
- For Group Loan Borrowers (partnerships, corporations, cooperative:
  - a. Minimum-Php100,000.00
  - b. Maximum Php5,000,000.00
- · Loan Repayment:

Short-Term - maximum of one (1) year;

- Term Loan based on cash flow but not to exceed 7 years, inclusive of maximum of 2 years grace period.
- · Loan Security/Collateral:
  - Object of financing
  - Mortgageable projected assets (machines or equipment) and other assets of the borrower.
- The enterprise should generate a cash flow sufficient to pay the project ted amortization of the loan.

# Workers Welfare Assistance Program



- · Eligible Projects: Franchising business / Contract tie-up with top 1000 corporations / Agri and non-agri production/manufacturing/ construction/rental business/ service/trading business/ transport service/ any viable project whether existing or new
- · The enterprise should generate a cash flow sufficient to pay the projected amortization of the loan.

#### **✓** Qualifications

- · OWWA member, active or non-active
- Has completed Enhanced Entrepreneurial Development Training (EEDT)
- OFWs working abroad, or about to leave may be represented by the following:
  - If OFW is married, by the legal spouse
  - If OFW is single, widow, widower, or separated-in-fact:
  - Parents not more than sixty (60) years old
  - Children who are at least eighteen (18) years old

#### i. On-site Assistance and services extended to OFWs at the jobsites:

- Assistance on OFW's whereabouts
- Psycho-social counseling
- ·Mediation/conciliation with employer
- Airport assistance
- Hospital/prison/work camp visitations
- ·Legal assistance to OFWs who wish to pursue labor/welfare case against their employer in the host country

#### ii. In -country Assistance extended to OFWs/families at the home front:

- ·Post-repatriation assistance
- ·Counseling, referral, and other concerns

## **EDUCATION FOR DEVELOPMENT SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM (EDSP)**

The Education for Development Scholarship Program (EDSP) is a scholarship program that offers financial assistance to qualified dependents of active OWWA members who shall enroll or is currently enrolled in any four-year or five-year baccalaureate course in any college or university. A financial assistance of Sixty Thousand Pesos (Php60,000.00) per year shall be provided to the scholar.

#### **EDSP QUALIFICATION**

#### INCOMING

- · Must be a child or sibling of a single or married but childless OFW.
- · Membership of the OFW must be ACTIVE. If INACTIVE, plus 6 mos. grace period.
- Grade 12 graduating student or a Grade 12 graduate student but haven't enrolled in any college/universities yet.
- · Must have no failing grades.
- Must not be more than 21 years old upon application.
- Must have an 80% GWA from Grade 9, 10 & 11.
- •Willing to enroll in Philippine-based college/universities.

### CURRENTLY ENROLLED (2nd - 5th yr.)

- Must be a child or sibling of a single or married but childless OFW.
- Membership of the OFW must be ACTIVE. If INACTIVE, plus 6 mos. grace period.
- Must not be more than 30 years old upon application.
- · Must have an 85% GWA or its equivalent from the previous school year.
- Enrolled in Philippine-based college/universities.

#### OFW-DEPENDENT SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM (ODSP)

A scholarship program that offers financial assistance amounting to Php20,000.00 per school year to qualified dependents of OFWs who receive a monthly salary of not more than US\$600.00, and who shall enroll in any 4 to 5-year baccalaureate or associate course in a state university/college within the Philippines.

#### **ODSP QUALIFICATION**

#### INCOMING 1ST YEAR (13) slot per province

- Must be less than 600 and basic salary.
- Active membership status (OFW)
- · Grade 12 grades 1st and 2nd sem with 75% above average
- Regular loads

#### CURRENTLY IN COLLEGE (12) slot per province

- Must be less than 600 USD basic salary.
- Active membership status (OFW)
- · Last year grades 1st and 2nd sem with 75% above average
- Regular loads

## EDUCATION AND LIVELIHOOD ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (ELAP)

Education Component - a program intended for: a) survivors of deceased OFWS who were active OWWA members at the time of death; and b) qualified dependents of OFWs who are/were incarcerated/convicted and meted out the death penalty in foreign countries who have at least one OWWA membership contribution. It offers financial assistance for primary (Php5,000.00/year), secondary (Php8,000.00/year) and tertiary education (Php10,000.00/year) per school year in any school accredited by DepEd, CHED and TESDA

## EDUCATIONAL ASSISTANCE THROUGH SCHOLARSHIP IN EMERGENCIES (EASE)

(EASE) is for the dependent of the returning OFW members affected by COvid-19 Pandemic. An educational assistance amounting to PHP10, 000.00 per annum for a maximum of four (4) years in College level is given to qualified dependent of active OWWA member-OFW's at the time of their repatriation to the country from the declaration of the outbreak on 01 February 2020, up until the pandemic is declared controlled and managed by the World Health Organization (WHO) or any other component authorities.
