GUIDELINES FOR THE SEARCH FOR OUTSTANDING SCHOOL ORGANIZATION YEAR 3 in DepEd Bohol (O.S.O.Y3).

The award aims to recognize outstanding accomplishments of student leaders, teacher-advisers and school organizations in their respective institutions and communities.

Specifically, it aims to:

1. recognize the program of the school organization that created an impact and addressed the issues and challenges in their school and community;
2. inspire and encourage student leaders and teacher-advisers of all public school in the Division of Bohol to implement and develop programs that will help their school and communities; and,
3. acknowledge and honor the idea of solidarity and teamwork by recognizing the group instead of one individual.

A. ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

The award is open to all school organizations for SY 2022-2023 in all public schools both in elementary and secondary schools. The project entry may be:

1. The school organizations' sustained projects both in school and community.
2. Recently concluded project, or
3. An on-going project.
4. The project represents any of the four core values of the Department of Education, the Maka-Diyos, Maka-Tao, Makakalikasan at Makabansa.

B. Categories

Must bear the name of the School and School Organization: (SSG/SPG/YES-O & other school org.

- A. Outstanding School Organization - Maka- Diyos Category
- B. Outstanding School Organization - Maka- Tao Category
- C. Outstanding School Organization - Maka- Bansa Category
- D. Outstanding School Organization - Maka- Kalikasan Category

Special programs of the Youth Formation

Must bear the name of the School, School Head and Teacher-Adviser:

- E. Best BKD Implementer
- F. Best YES-O Program Implementer
- G. Best Gulayan sa Paaralan Program Implementer

Maka-Diyos (Belief and Traditions) Category

The "Maka-Diyos" category aims to recognize outstanding projects of the SPG/SSG/YES-O and other recognized school organizations that promote culture of peace, respect and love despite the multi-cultural population of the school community.

Maka-Tao (Human Development, Health and Well-being) Category

The "Maka-Tao" category aims to recognize outstanding project of SSG/SPG/YES-O and other recognized school organizations that address the human development, health and well-being of the school community.



Makakalikasan (Environment and Disaster Risk Reduction Management) Category

The “Makakalikasan” category aims to recognize outstanding projects of the SSG/SPG/YES-O and other recognized school organization, that is promoting biodiversity and ecological awareness, environmental protection, conservation, and preservation programs. This category also wishes to recognize the projects, programs and activities on disaster risk reduction management and climate change adaptation; Programs on disaster prevention, rescue operation, and rehabilitation.

Makabansa (Heritage, Culture, Nationalism, Patriotism and Volunteerism)

The “Makabansa” Category aims to recognize outstanding projects of SPG/SSG/YES-O and other recognized school organizations on promoting Filipino culture, values and Nationalism, Patriotism and Volunteerism. This category includes projects, programs and activities that demonstrate pride of being a Filipino and exercise the rights and responsibilities of being a Filipino.

BARKADA KONTRA DROGA (BKD) Drug Prevention Program

This special category supports one of the 10-Point Agenda of the Secretary of Education and the current administration on addressing the problem on drugs. This category wishes to recognize the projects, programs and activities on drug education.

C. Search Process

All school organization shall compete starting from the school level to the division level.

1. School level: The School shall be selecting 1 nominee per category.
2. District level: The District Award committee shall be selecting 1 nominee per category both in elementary and secondary levels.
3. Division level: The Division Award committee shall choose 1 winner per category both in elementary and secondary levels.

D. Prize

1. The winners in each category will receive plaque of recognition for the following:
 - a. Student Leader
 - b. Teacher Adviser
 - c. School Organization.

E. Criteria

A. Impact of the Project Implemented	30%
B. Teamwork on Implementing Projects	25%
C. Creativity and Innovation	25%
D. Effective Use of Resources	20%

GENERAL RULES:

1.) Accomplish the official “O.S.O. Y3” application form.
2.) Use white, A4 size bond paper for the attachment of all supporting documents.
3.) All participating students shall secure and submit a signed parents’ consent to the school principal.
4.) All individuals involved in the project organization and its implementation shall always observe the health and safety protocols.
5.) Submit documents and pictures that will support and validates the rating of each criterion. MOVs shall follow the order of each criterion for easy rating.
6.) Lack or non-compliance to the requirements will result to automatic disqualification.



7.) The organizer reserves the rights to modify or amend the rules of the awards or waive compliance therewith at their sole discretion if such steps are in accordance with the purpose of the search and awards scheme.
8.) All decision of the awards committee and panel of judges are final and irrevocable.
9.) All material submitted to the awards committee automatically become property of the Youth Formation Section of the SGOD DepEd Bohol.
