#### SCHOOLS TO ADOPT DISTANCE LEARNING DURING INTENSE HEAT

To: Assistant Schools Division Superintendents CID, and SGOD Chiefs

- 1. The Department Education (DepEd) Region VII through DepEd Order No. 037, s. 2022, titled "Guidelines on the Cancellation or Suspension of Classes and Work in Schools in the Event of Natural Disasters, Power Outages/Power Interruptions and Other Calamites" and Memorandum Mo. OUOPS No. 2024-04-02477, hereby issues the following guidelines in the suspension of classes in consideration of the welfare of the learners affected by extreme climate conditions in attending face-to-face classes:
  - a) DepEd schools adheres to suspension of classes as declared by the Local Government Unit (LGU);
  - b) Where there is no LGU declaration, the principals/schools heads have the authority and responsibility to suspend in person-classes between 11:00 to 3:00 pm where extreme heat occurs;
  - Face-to-Face classes can only be scheduled between 6:00am to 10:00 am or 3:00 pm to 6:00 pm; nigh classes will continue with the time schedule of classes;
  - d) Modules shall be distributed to the learners in advance so that in the eventual suspension of Face-to-Face classes and other calamities or interruptions, teachers and learners will be having no difficulty getting and distributing the same;
  - e) Teaching and non-teaching personnel in all public schools are not required to report to their stations when asynchronus classes/distance learning is

implemented, hence, will adopt the Work-From-Home schedule and guidelines;

- f) Private schools has the discretion, if not included in the suspension of classes as declared by the LGU concerned;
- g) MATATAG Trainings will continue as scheduled provided mitigation and other relevant issuances shall be complied.
- 2. It is emphasized that SITUATION-BASED APPROACH shall be adopted in all cases where health ad safety of learners are at risk.
- 3. The Education Program Supervisors and Public Schools District Supervisors are directed to monitor schools under their area of jurisdiction and submit reports to the Division Office weekly.
- 4. Immediate dissemination and strict compliance is desired.
