**TRAINING ON INCLUSIVE PATHWAYS: ASSESSMENT, STRATEGIES, AND  
TRANSITIONS FOR LEARNERS WITH DISABILITIES (LWDs)**

To: Schools Division Superintendents  
All Other Concerned Personnel

1. Pursuant to the Department of Education's commitment to strengthen inclusive education practices, the Department of Education Regional Office VII, through the Curriculum and Learning Management Division (CLMD), in collaboration with the Schools Division of Cebu City, shall conduct the Training on "Inclusive Pathways: Assessment, Strategies, and Transitions for Learners with Disabilities (LWDs)" on December 14–18, 2025, at Waterworld Resort Cebu, Mandaue City.
2. This five-day training aims to deepen the knowledge and skills of Supervisors, School Heads, and Receiving Teachers from both monograde and multigrade schools in the areas of assessment of learners with disabilities, inclusion processes, pedagogical strategies, and transition or exit planning. The activity underscores the importance of equipping school leaders and teachers with the necessary competencies to build inclusive schools and classrooms that promote equity, participation, and success for all learners.
3. The allocation of participants per schools division is provided in Enclosure No. 1. Participants are advised to bring their laptops and to pre-register online through the link to be provided. The first meal to be served is afternoon snacks on Day 1 (December 14, 2025), and the last meal is lunch on Day 5 (December 18, 2025). For the Program Management Team, the first meal is breakfast on Day 1, while the last meal is lunch on Day 5.
4. In preparation for the training, the management team—specifically the session designers, facilitators, and documenters—shall convene for a dry-run at 8:00 a.m. on December 14, 2025, at the same venue. This preparatory session aims to ensure the alignment of training content, flow, and materials with the objectives of the Inclusive Pathways program.
5. To foster camaraderie and celebrate the spirit of the season, the training shall also feature a Yuletide Celebration on Wednesday evening (December 17, 2025). Participants are expected to come in red attire and prepare a gift as part of the celebration. This activity will serve as an avenue to express gratitude, build stronger professional relationships, and honor the collective efforts of all program implementers.



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5. Accommodation, board and lodging of the participants shall be charged against 2025 SPED-PSF downloaded to Cebu City Division, while travel and other incidental expenses incurred shall be charged against local funds or other available funds subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
6. Immediate and wide dissemination of this memorandum is desired.
