**BOHOL GEOSCHOOLS GEOCONNECT: SHARING THE SIGNIFICANCE OF
LOCAL GEOLOGICAL HERITAGE**

1. In support of the Schools Division of Bohol to Bohol Island UNESCO Global Geopark and the 4Geon Program's continuing advocacy to strengthen geoscience education, environmental awareness, and heritage conservation among learners, the Schools Division of Bohol through the Curriculum Implementation Division (CID) shall conduct the Bohol Geoschools GeoConnect: Sharing the Significance of Local Geological Heritage for to **identified secondary geoschools** in two (2) Batches: July 18, 2026 and July 25, 2026 from 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m., via Teams.
2. This activity aims to:
 - a. provide a platform for 4Geon Club members to share and present the significant geological features of their identified geosites;
 - b. deepen learners' understanding of the geological heritage of Bohol and its relevance to environmental conservation and sustainable development;
 - c. foster collaboration, knowledge exchange, and appreciation among participating Geoschools; and
 - d. strengthen advocacy on geoconservation and geoeducation in the Division.
3. The participants in this activity are the active members of the 4Geon Club from the identified Geoschools of the Division of Bohol. Each participating school shall send three (3) to five (5) learners accompanied by one (1) teacher-adviser.

4. Each participating Geoschool shall prepare an online presentation featuring a geological site within their locality or any identified significant geosite in Bohol. The presentation shall cover the following:
 - a. Name and location of the geosite;
 - b. Geological history and origin;
 - c. Significant geological features and formations;
 - d. Scientific, cultural, and environmental significance;
 - e. Conservation efforts and existing challenges; and
 - f. Insights and reflections.
5. Participants are expected to observe proper online decorum and actively engage in the discussion. Certificates of participation and recognition shall be awarded.
6. An online meeting will be conducted on Friday, July 3, 2026 at 1:00 p.m. via Goggle Meet to all **Secondary 4Geon Club Advisers** and **Secondary 4Geon Presidents**.

Mechanics for Bohol Geoschools GeoConnect: Sharing the Significance of Local Geological Heritage

1. Participants

- The activity is open to all active 4Geon Club members from the identified Geoschools in the Division of Bohol.
- Each participating school shall be represented by three (3) to five (5) members with one teacher-adviser/focal person.

2. Mode of Activity

- The activity shall be conducted online via a designated virtual platform (e.g., Zoom, Google Meet, or Microsoft Teams).
- The schedule and meeting link shall be provided by the organizers prior to the event.

3. Presentation Content

Each school shall prepare and present a geological site within their locality or an identified significant geosite in Bohol, highlighting the following:

- Name and location of the geological site
- Geological history and origin
- Significant geological features and formations
- Scientific, cultural, and environmental importance
- Conservation efforts and challenges
- Personal insights and reflections on the geosite's significance

4. Presentation Format

- Each school shall be given 3-5 minutes for the presentation.
- Presentations may use PowerPoint, video clips, photos, maps, diorama or other visual materials.
- Creativity, accuracy, and clarity of information are encouraged.

5. Open Forum and Interaction

- After each presentation, there will be a 3–5 minute question-and-answer portion.
- Participants are encouraged to ask relevant questions and share insights.

7. Submission of Materials


- Presentation materials shall be submitted to the organizing committee at least three (3) days before the activity for documentation and review.

8. Recognition

- Certificates of Participation shall be awarded to all participants.
- Special recognition may be given for Best Presentation, Most Informative Presentation, and Best Geosite Advocacy.

9. General Guidelines

- Participants must observe proper online etiquette throughout the activity.
- Attendance and active participation are highly encouraged.
